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There are now four (4) FDA approved treatments in the United States available for some aspects of TSC or related conditions.


These approved options are:

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Telehealth

What does telehealth mean?

Telehealth — sometimes called telemedicine — lets your health care provider provide care for you without an in-person office visit. Telehealth is done primarily online with internet access on your computer, tablet, or smartphone.

There are several options for telehealth care:


- Talk to your health care provider live over the phone or video chat.
- Send and receive messages from your health care provider using secure messaging, email, secure messaging, and secure file exchange.
- Use remote monitoring so your health care provider can check on you at home. For
 example, you might use a device to gather vital signs or other vitals to help your health
 care provider stay informed on your progress.



What is the DD Act and why is it important?

Gives people with I/DD equal rights to access and be included in their communities.

- In every state and territory, programs authorized by the DD Act empower individuals with developmental disabilities and their families to help shape policies that affect them.
- DD Act programs conduct important research and test innovative new service delivery models.

The NGCDD is seeking proposals for grants to help meet the Council's goals and objectives listed in the Draft Five-Year State Plan for Federal Fiscal Year 2022-2026 which can be found at www.nevadaddcouncil.org.

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First Responder Education and Training Grant

Original grants were focused on training first responders to recognize and effectively interact with individuals with autism and other neurodevelopmental disabilities.

Due to the success of the trainings funded by the grants, the latest grant is to "train the trainer" such that more opportunities to educate and train first responders can be provided.

In the Nevada Legislative Sessions 2019 to 2020, a law was amended such that persons applying for a first responder license must complete training concerning identifying and interacting with persons with developmental disabilities.
